We are built on the belief that all people are equally deserving of the love and companionship of a pet, Halifax Humane Society's work is rooted in compassion and equality.

Our History

The Halifax Humane Society started in the early 1930's and was officially incorporated as the Daytona Beach Humane Society of Volusia County in 1937.

The first headquarters was created in 1939 and included a business office, living quarters, and kennels for the animals.

In 2019, HHS unveils its renovated adoption center, which is now known as the Lohman Adoption Center.

In Fall of 2024, the Open Paw program was officially adopted in the shelter.



Open Paw Methodology

Open Paw's mission is to give people and their pets the tools they need to develop a successful relationship with one another and their communities.

The goal is to prevent the surrender, abandonment, and euthanasia of unwanted animals by making sure that they do not become unwanted.



Open Paw Goals

Education: Educate staff, volunteers, and the community about animal behavior and care.

Elevate Shelters: Turn every animal shelter into place where the community can go to learn about animals, including gaining basic training and behavior skills to increase adoption.

Opportunities: Training methods – cues and method training, leash handling, training walks-private, safe handling, kitten care, cat socialization, and many more!

Animal Shelter Support

Volunteering in the animal shelter is one of the most exciting and rewarding experiences at Halifax Humane Society. Opportunities in this program area include participating in every aspect of shelter operations, helping with pet adoptions at both shelter and off-site locations, staffing the front desk, photo shoots to promote pet adoptions, promoting Petco Love Lost, our lost and found service, ensuring the shelter's laundry needs are met, and assisting in our retail pet supply store.





Vet Services

Spaying and neutering dogs and cats to prevent homeless puppies and kittens is provided at both our public clinic and at our shelter location. We offer volunteer opportunities in both clinics. As a volunteer, you help clean and prep surgery instrument packs, help with laundry, and even help monitor pets as they recover from surgery.

Our foster home program is managed by the Veterinary Services team. Fostering is a critical part of saving the lives of homeless and abandoned animals in our community.

- Please avoid making a commitment that you may be unable to fulfill or take on responsibilities for which you feel unqualified.
- If you need to cancel or reschedule, log into Galaxy Digital and cancel your shift(s) This makes it available for other volunteers.
- Volunteers who no-show more than 3 times may be removed from the program.

Dress Code

Casual workplace appropriate clothing:

- Volunteer shirt and name tag.
- No short-shorts, skirts or other exposing attire. No rips, fading, or frays.
- Closed toe shoes are required.
- Long pants are required when conducting potty/dog walks. Avoid leggings, or thin material.
- Attire that includes offensive language, religious, or political statements is not permitted.

Each special event will have its own dress code and will be detailed in the description displayed on Galaxy Digital. While most special events are casual, our signature Fur Ball event is formal. Specific information will be provided for each volunteer position.





Shelter Safety

Animals in a shelter environment do NOT behave like animals in a home environment.

- Do not stick fingers/hands/face into kennels.
- Pay attention to the body language of the animal.
- Ask staff before interacting with an animal.
- Read **EVERYTHING**: Kennels, job descriptions, and emails.
- Follow guidelines for dog walking.
- Approach all animals with care.
- Report **ALL** injuries immediately to supervisor on duty.
- Important: please fill out an incident report.

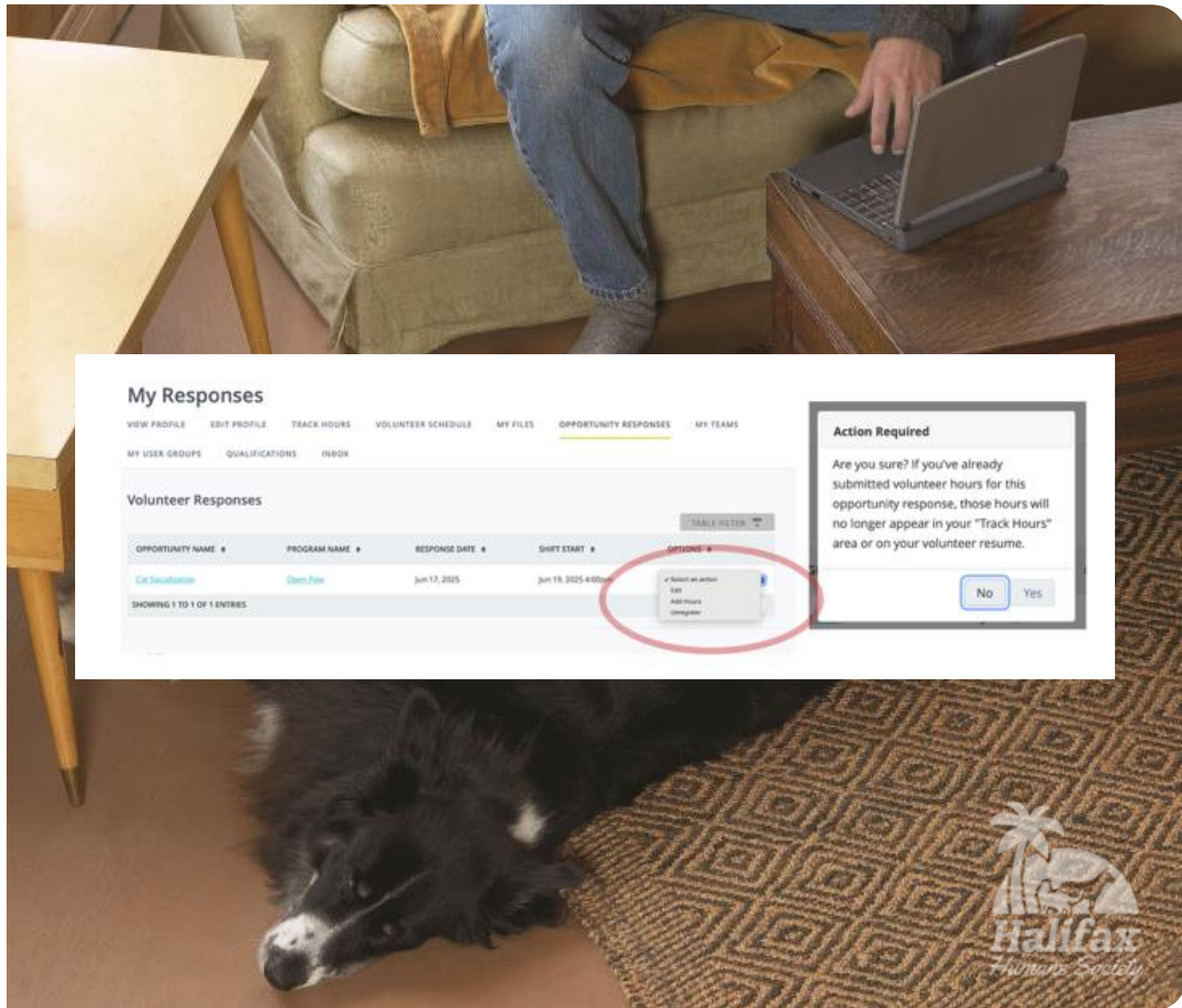
